A huge thank you to everyone who gave up their Saturday to help fundraise for school and for all the donations. The pupils will enjoy having lots of new resources!



This term, we've gone back in time to the Tudor period! From reading fun and factual books like 'Royal Animals, An Illustrated History' - to discovering the fascinating life of Henry VIII and his six wives, we've become true Tudor experts.

In History, we explored Tudor kings and queens, while in English we dived into both fiction and non-fiction texts, helping us learn new words and facts. We've also worked hard on developing our writing and communication skills.

A short but very busy half term for Class 12,

This half term has been mostly dedicated to our exam practice and sitting our Functional Skills examinations. The majority of pupils have now sat their English reading and writing, as well as their maths exams. We're very proud of how hard everyone tried with their exams, no matter the results. We've also had our final push to finish our PDP Silver and Transforming Aspirations qualifications, which has included a range of activities, including a trip to Sir Tom Finney High School's careers event, designing and making bird boxes in forest schools and recapping on fire safety we learnt about in our SENDsafe sessions.

Everyone has also had lots of fun at swimming each week, building confidence in the water and enjoying a variety of pool games. We're looking forward to our trip to Preston train station in the last week of this half term, exploring the station and the different careers in the train service.

I am personally very proud of each and every pupil in Class 12 for their perseverance and hard work this half term, they made it through the final push with both exams and accreditations and kept going even when they've found some things tricky.

In class 10 we have all had a lovely start to the summer term.

We have made the most of the sunshine and spent time in our forest school area. All pupils thoroughly enjoyed this outdoor learning and play time, as well as getting to experience newly hatched ducklings and see them grow. As well as this, science lessons have been taking place in the garden area of school, where pupils have been able to explore animal habitats. During PE lessons we have continued to work on sensory circuits, focussing on gross motor skills to play throwing and catching games with partners and developing confidence to walk and balance across a beam. Our overall topic this half term has been rainforests, we have been reading 'Roaming in the Rainforest' during English and have been able to learn key words and match these to images from this story. As well as this, pupils have been working on their fine motor skills to aid writing and also building sentences using colourful semantics. All pupils have continued to make progress in maths, looking at number and shape. This has been a great start to the last term of the year, in class 10 everyone is continuing to flourish in their own ways and develop independence and self-help skills.

Class 5

We have had a very busy half term exploring and learning about animals. Our sensory stories were 'Walking in the Jungle' by Debbie Harter and 'Who's in the Forest' by Phyllis Gershator. We also had lots of scaffolded play with animals using Makaton/PECS symbols to name the different animals and used sound buttons to imitate animal sounds. In maths we have been learning about measure looking at long snakes and short worms and counting pieces of food when feeding animals. In PSHE we have been looking at how we take care of ourselves by eating a healthy diet, practising our personal hygiene skills, doing exercise and relaxing too. We learnt about the different habitats of animals in science, lots of sensory play, it was so much fun! In RE we learnt about Hinduism visiting the Mandir temple, we all felt very welcome; playing instruments, touring the different areas, ringing the bells, looking at the statues and much more. In PE we have worked on our dressing skills and creating our own sensory circuits using coloured symbols then carrying them out. In music we have been imitating animal noises using a guiro, boomwhackers, drums and rainmakers and in computing we have created our own animal photo book, we used a camera/iPad to take photos, printed them out and put them into an album to share with our friends.

Class 8 have been learning about the Iron Age. We have followed the story of the 'Iron Age Boy' and also made our own woolly mammoth and round house. Maths has had a focus on Time and how to use time in the most functional way.

History was a continuation of the Iron Age and included a visit to the round house. The pupils have also worked hard on their employability skills doing jobs around the school and making use of effective equipment.

Class 14 have had a very exciting half term and have managed to fit in lots of community visits. For our AQA unit, we have been taking part in some work experience in the community, visiting a local park and picking up some litter. The students have really enjoyed making the park clean and were all fantastic using the litter pickers! We have also been practising our communication skills within the community, visiting The Station Cafe, McDonalds and Wallings Ice Cream parlour. We have been using theme boards to help us make choices and to communicate our orders to the staff in the venues. We have also been working very hard completing some of our accreditation work, the students have all worked so hard over the year and should all be proud of their achievements. We have also been having a college sunflower contest, they are all growing well and we are excited to see who the winner will be!







This half term, Class 2 have fully embraced our animal-themed topic and have had a wonderful time learning through a wide range of engaging activities.

Science and geography - We've explored different animal habitats and looked closely at where and how animals live. Weekly visits to the Forest Classroom brought this learning to life, where we observed snails in their natural environment and watched ducklings hatch and grow. Seeing their very first swim was a truly magical and memorable experience for all.

English - We have shared two fantastic sensory stories: Hole in the Zoo and Big Red Barn.

The children have been brilliant at answering key questions, making connections to the text, and exploring the story props. Some even took on the role of storyteller, reading confidently to the class and leading our story sessions – they really knew the stories inside out!

Maths - In maths, we've focused on using coins to count to 10p. The children especially enjoyed the Class 2 Shop, where they practised exchanging coins for items. They also applied their learning during weekly visits to Aldi, where they: followed a shopping list, selected their item and then they used the self – checkout to pay. This real-world experience helped develop confidence and independence.

PSHE – Our PSHE topic focused on people who help us at home and school. Each week, we learned an important part of self-care, including: brushing our teeth and washing our hands. We also talked about how others help us with these routines.

In PE, we've been moving like the animals we've been learning about! There were fierce tigers, cheeky monkeys, and lots of laughter as the children expressed themselves through movement and rhythm.

In class 6 our topic has been 'On the Road'. We have had lots of transport themed lessons including our phonics and story 'On the Road with Mavis and Marge'. We have been doing some transport themed position and direction and number work in maths. In our Science lessons we have been learning about forces and motion whilst developing playing and social skills. In our music lesson we have been developing social and communication skills whilst engaging in transport themed songs.

We have been lucky enough to have Super Ball Paul for our PE sessions; we have all loved these and engaged really well.

We have also been to Forest Schools each week, we have had the chance to see the chick eggs hatch, we then saw them once they had grown swimming in the water. We have also learnt about snails; we looked at them and chopped up fruit to feed them.

We have loved being outdoors this half term and have been developing our independence skills on a daily walk around the triangle before enjoying the climbing frames and gym equipment in the walled garden.





















We have had a great half-term in Class 3 learning all about 'Animals and their Habitats'.

Our story this half-term has been 'Dear Zoo'. In the story, a little boy wrote to the zoo to ask them to send him a pet but some of the animals they sent were too big, too grumpy, too jumpy and too scary. Eventually, the zoo sent him a puppy which was perfect! This got the children thinking about the different pets that they would like to have. They came up with some super suggestions including lizards, cats, fish and even butterflies. The children then painted some super pictures of them and came up with a describing word.

In maths, the children have been learning all about money and have had lots of fun visiting our class story to spend their money. The children were really good at exchanging coins for toys and understood that items must be paid for before they could leave. As they became more confident with this, they learnt about the different coloured coins and even had a go at paying for toys which required them to pay with either a silver or brown coin. It was lots of fun and the children were really good at looking at which coin they needed to use to pay.

During our afternoon lessons, the children have been learning all about different animal habitats in science and look at animals that came from the artic, the sea, the desert, the rainforest and their back gardens. Over the term, the children became more confident at matching the different animals to the different habitats and really enjoyed going to our walled garden to look for animals living in their natural habitat. The children have also been creating animal art work in art and have made some lovely animal models using clay, some animal mosaics and some animal shadow pictures.

The children also enjoyed a visit from Gramps the tortoise and the petting zoo!

























Class 1 - This half term has been a short but busy one! On our 'jungle' theme we have explored sensory stories, including 'Rumble in the Jungle' and 'Walking through the Jungle'. In Maths we've been learning about addition and subtraction through practical play activities, and have been exploring 3D shapes too. We have especially enjoyed our weekly PE sessions including our dance-freeze warm up, and our new 'Super Ball Paul' sessions in the hall! With regard to PSED we have started to practice brushing our teeth daily and continue to work hard on other self care and independence skills. We now attend assembly with the other primary classes in the hall weekly and have enjoyed meeting with different peer groups. In the afternoons we have had fun engaging with a wide variety of jungle themed arts and crafts, music, malleable and messy play activities!

This half term class 9 have loved having superball Paul for our PE sessions and doing lots of different throwing and catching exercises.



In English we listened to a story about a rainforest and practised reading sentences connected to the rainforest as well as identifying what we can see and hear using theme boards to support. Our geography has also been focused on learning about the rainforest and the animals that live there.

Our science lessons have involved looking at forest and microhabitats. We have used magnifying glasses to look at minibeasts and identify what we have found. For forest schools we enjoyed looking at the duck eggs and seeing the ducklings after they had hatched.

In PSHE we have learnt about friendship and good and bad relationships. In computing we learnt what an animation is and made our own gifs using a flipbook website.
